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



We identified 9 different research-policy engagement practices, that speak to three different ways of thinking about how to improve evidence use in government












About 16% of the literature we found had been peer reviewed

**We found pockets of learning from evaluations that offer a rich and nuanced picture**



**Often new initiatives fail to draw on this existing learning. Many organisations funded multiple activities, used different policy engagement practices, and didn't articulate clear goals.**

**To make the most of growing investment in research-policy engagement, we need clearer evidence about what works and how organisations can support each other to achieve shared goals.**
